Second Harvest: East Orlando underserved

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One month ago Trina Gonzales could pay her bills and pick up a few groceries now and then.

Then her husband of 15 years left her with \$1,500 in unpaid bills and rent she could not afford.

Odd jobs like bartending, cleaning homes and cooking keep bill collectors at bay and a friend agreed to help pay her rent, but her pantry remains bare.

Last Thursday she was able to pick up fresh bread, canned meats and vegetables, baking items, fruit and some sweets from the Semoran Food Pantry.

Nearly half of the two tons of product the food pantry gives away each week is provided by the Second Harvest Food Bank on Brengle Avenue in Orlando.
